Lost in Books

Lost in Books is a kids' multilingual bookshop, café, safe space for women, creative learning centre, and language exchange hub based in Fairfield, in south-western Sydney — Australia's most culturally diverse community. Lost in Books offers a bountiful public program around books, literacy, multilingual conversation, and wellbeing. Lost in Books promotes multilingual literacy, community safety, connectedness and exchange. It's a social enterprise, which means that any profits will be reinvested back into the project.

This year we have been providing [Storyville](#) storytellers to Lost in Books and have partnered with Lost in Books on a Government grant application. This project is an open Studio Space for multilingual text and literature exploration. Facilitated by [Storyville](#) storytellers there will be hourly performances of multilingual texts followed by open discussion around the concepts and characters of each narrative.

Indigenous Literacy Fund

We will be working with the Indigenous Literacy Fund to bring first language books written and published by communities into schools around Australia through [Storyville](#) school residencies and Live Streaming initiatives.

In May 2019, The Indigenous Literacy Fund have invited a [Storyville](#) representatives to their annual Tiwi Island trip to host [Storyville](#)'s story time with the local school and community.



2019 & BEYOND

Department of Education, Victoria

We have been developing a partnership with the Department of Education to bring [Storyville](#) into regional, country and rural schools using the Webex Cisco platform. Recently, this hardware and software has been installed at all 1600 schools in Victoria. The Department is partnering with organisations including the Museum of Victoria, ACMI and [Storyville](#) to provide exciting educational experiences from remote locations into the classroom.

As of December 2018, [Storyville](#) will be live streaming to 4 regional schools in Victoria where reading and literacy has been identified as a number one priority for the schools in those areas. The Department will be facilitating the process and feedback to position us for a successful Term 1, 2019.

As this initiative develops, [Storyville](#) hopes to be a weekly event listed on the government website available for schools to sign in and join the virtual [Storyville](#) classroom facilitating cross-school connections and awareness.



Books in Homes

We have been working with Books in Homes to form a three-prong approach that enhances our Live Streaming initiative. The [Storyville](#) Role Models project will see a 10 storytellers visit schools for one-off assembly gifting books to schools and term long residencies.

Currently Books in Homes is in 710 schools and communities providing thousands of books to thousands of students across Australia. The [Storyville](#) Role Model project will commence in Term 4 this year as introductions in public school assembly events and residencies to begin in Term 1, 2019.
